



## Leadership Selection

The Student Voice Executive selection is decided by an application process. Students submit an application to a panel consisting of a parent representative, Governing Council representative, Student Voice Coordinator, two students and one past student who are either past Student Voice Executive members or School Captain. Nine students are selected for the whole school year.

The R-6 Action Group selection is completed in each class. Two students (one girl, one boy) are selected to represent their class. Classes use a variety of ways for this selection to happen. After Semester 1 (This is Term 1 and 2) new students take on the position of representing their class for Semester 2.

The role of School Captain and the process for selection is explained to senior students and year 6 students during week 1 of the new school year. After completing a nomination form, which needs to be signed by a leader within the school stating that students match the skills and abilities required to be school captain, they are interviewed by a panel, consisting of two Student Voice Executive representatives, past senior school captain, the chairperson of the Governing Council, a parent representative and the Student Voice Coordinator.

## Induction and Training

All of these leadership positions are announced at an Induction Assembly held in Term one. Students in the R-6 Action Group and the Junior School Captains have a training day where they learn the leadership skills required to be a member of the committee and to be part of a team.

The Student Voice Executive members along with the School Captains, Vice Captains and Junior Captains have a training day where they are challenged to step outside of their comfort zone by participating in activities which focus on leadership, team work, resilience, communication and decision making. This year students will be attending the Grip Student Leadership Conference held at Adelaide Entertainment Centre.
