You may be wondering, What does a Governing Council do?

Governing Councils work with the principal to help set and monitor the direction of a school. It meets regularly, usually twice per school term. Our Governing Council meets in the evening of the 2nd Wednesday of each month, where possible, or on other dates as negotiated.

Meetings are part of Governing Council but it's not only that. In your role on the council you might be on a committee with Community Links, Grounds and Facilities, Sport and Rec or Out of School Hours Care [OSHC]

You do not work alone when on the council. We work together to involve the local community, develop and approve local policies, set the broad direction and vision of the site, monitor and review the Site Improvement Plan and as the employing authority of the Out Of School Hours Care service.

Thanks you to our Governing Council who have again granted a School Closure Day on Friday March 1, following our traditional Twilight Sports Day on February 29. This event holds such a special place in the hearts of many of our community members and there is already a great vibe in the school as we prepare for it.

Our canteen service this year is being managed by Café Moonta. As of Monday Feb 12 orders will be accepted via the Spriggy App or lunch bags placed in classroom bags. Recess options will also be available for over the counter purchases from our beautiful canteen facility. Thank you to Café Moonta who will be running this service 5 days a week.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is an evidence-based framework that brings together the whole-school community to contribute to developing a positive, safe and supportive learning culture. The framework assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people.

PBL focuses on teaching behavioural skills through explicit instruction. Through this approach, PBL is both preventative and responsive to the needs of children and young people.

NAPLAN

National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy Information for parents and carers

- All students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 in Australia do NAPLAN tests in March each year.
- NAPLAN tests students' skills in reading, writing and maths.
- The test questions are presented in Standard Australian English dialect.
- Students read some of the questions and listen to others with headphones.
- The tests will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going in the test.
- Students do four different tests. The names of the four tests are:



- Students in Year 3 will do the Writing test using pencil and paper. Year 3 students will answer the other test questions on the computer.
- Students in Years 5, 7 and 9 will answer all their test questions on computers.
- Teachers will help students get ready for NAPLAN tests.
- Schools will get their students' results. The school will then give parents/carers a report showing their own child's results.
- Parents/carers can talk to the teacher about these results.
- NAPLAN shows how students are going all over Australia. People who work in the Australian Government, state and territory education authorities and schools use NAPLAN results. The results let them see which schools are doing well and which schools might need help.

Talk to your teacher if you have any questions about your child doing the tests.
