2024 School Starters

Students will participate in hands-on experiences and learn new school routines ready for their first school day. In Term 4, the School Starters will participate in several transition sessions, which will occur throughout the school day.



Science in Reception

This term, we have been learning about Living and Non-Living Things. Students have learnt that living things need air, water, food and the sun to grow. Over the term, we have watched the life cycle of a butterfly. We watched the caterpillar form a chrysalis and turn into a beautiful butterfly. When the butterflies came out of the chrysalis, it was amazing to see them stretch their beautiful wings. We planted 'butterfly friendly' plants to encourage butterflies to come to our area.






Sonya Rankine Weaving Workshop
