Community Sport Achievement

Brock Penna recently shot at Mid North Archers, Port Pirie, in the Archery Australia National and State Indoor Championships, which were held on Saturday 8th and Sunday 9th July. He was selected as the U14 representative in the Archery SA State Youth Recurve Team and they placed 4th for the event.

Brock was successful in his U14 Male Recurve division – achieving 1074/1200 which earnt him Gold Nationally and in the State.

Brock stepped up and brought a fight to the Open Male Recurve division, achieving 1082/1200 which placed him 20th Nationally, out of 78, and 4th in the State, despite experiencing equipment failure early in the Sunday shoot.

An amazing achievement for someone who has only been shooting a Recurve for less than 12 months due to battling target panic with a compound 11 months ago.


